BIRDS: (130)

DUCKS, GEESE AND SWANS: Anatidae: (12)

Graylag Goose *Anser anser* — (3) Biggest numbers, 300 plus birds, at Vadu in Romania on day 3.

Mute Swan Cygnus olor — (7) Fairly common and widespread.

Common Shelduck *Tadorna tadorna* — (5) Small numbers on saline lakes in both countries, most at Lake Atanasovsko in Bulgaria.

Garganey Spatula querquedula — (1) Just one seen, at Lake Shabla in Bulgaria on day 5.

Northern Shoveler *Spatula clypeata* — (5) Flocks of 100 plus seen on wetlands in both countries. **Gadwall** $Mareca\ strepera\ -$ (3) Less than 10 in total seen.

Eurasian Wigeon Mareca penelope — (2) Less than 10 seen, all on Lake Sable in Bulgaria.

Mallard Anas platyrhynchos — (6) Fairly common and widespread in both countries.

Northern Pintail Anas acuta — (2) A few seen on Lakes Shabla and Atanasovsko in Bulgaria on days 5 and 6.

Green-winged (Eurasian) Teal Anas crecca — (7) Flocks of 100s seen on wetlands in both countries.

Red-crested Pochard *Netta rufina* — (2) Only seen in Romania, less than 10 in total.

Common Pochard Aythya ferina — (1) Two seen on Lake Mandra in Bulgaria on day 9.

Ferruginous Duck *Aythya nyroca* — (3) A few seen in Romania on days 2 and 3, and on Lake Mandra in Bulgaria on day 9.

PHEASANTS, PARTRIDGES AND ALLIES: Phasianidae: (1)

Ring-necked Pheasant *Phasianus colchicus* — (4) Single birds seen, males and females, in both countries, and others heard.

FLAMINGOS: Phoenicopteridae: (1)

Greater Flamingo Phoenicopterus roseus — (3) Several 100s on lakes Shabla and Atanasovsko in Bulgaria.

GREBES: Podicipedidae: (3)

Little Grebe *Tachybaptus ruficollis* — (5) Scattered sightings in both countries.

Great Crested Grebe *Podiceps cristatus* — (2) A few seen at the Pomorie saltpans and on Lake Mandra in Bulgaria.

Eared Grebe *Podiceps nigricollis* — (4) Scattered sightings of small numbers in Bulgaria.

PIGEONS AND DOVES: Columbidae: (4)

Rock (Feral) Pigeon Columba livia — (10) Widespread. Only feral "domestica" birds seen.

Common Wood-Pigeon *Columba palumbus* — (9) Small numbers seen almost daily in both countries.

European Turtle-Dove Streptopelia turtur - (1) Just one seen, on day 2 in Romania.

Eurasian Collared-Dove *Streptopelia decaocto* — (10) Common and widespread, seen in settlements in both countries throughout.

CUCKOOS: Cuculidae: (1)

Common Cuckoo Cuculus canorus — (1) One on a roadside wire near Lake Mandra, Bulgaria, on day 9.

RAILS, COOTS AND ALLIES: Rallidae: (3)

Water Rail Rallus aquaticus — (H) Heard on day 9 at Lake Mandra in Bulgaria.

Eurasian Moorhen Gallinula chloropus — (3) Heard on day 5 and seen on days 7 and 9, all in Bulgaria.

Eurasian Coot Fulica atra — (4) Dozens seen on several wetlands in Bulgaria.

THICK-KNEES: Burhinidae: (1)

Eurasian Thick-knee Burhinus oedicnemus — (1) A dozen on steppe near Balgarevo, Bulgaria, on day 4.

STILTS AND AVOCETS: Recurvirostridae: (2)

Black-winged Stilt *Himantopus himantopus* — (2) Small numbers seen on days 3 and 9 on saline wetlands in both countries.

Pied Avocet Recurvirostra avosetta — (2) A few at Vadu in Romania on day 3 and about 100 on day 9 at Lake Atanasovsko in Bulgaria.

PLOVERS AND LAPWINGS: Charadriidae: (3)

Northern Lapwing Vanellus vanellus — (2) Seen on coastal wetlands in Romania on days 2 and 3.

Common Ringed Plover *Charadrius hiaticula* — (2) Scattered sightings, all in Bulgaria.

Little Ringed Plover Charadrius dubius — (3) Close views at Pomorie in Bulgaria on days 7 and 9.

SANDPIPERS AND ALLIES: Scolopacidae: (12)

Eurasian Curlew Numenius arquata — (1) Three seen on day 3 at Vadu, Romania.

Ruff Calidris pugnax — (3) Birds in non-breeding plumage seen, dozens at Vadu in Romania and Lake Atanasovsko in Bulgaria.

Dunlin Calidris alpina — (3) A few seen at Vadu on day 3 and Lake Shabla on days 5 and 6.

Common Snipe *Gallinago gallinago* — (3) Several seen in both countries, mostly in flight but also on the ground at Lake Shabla in Bulgaria.

Red-necked Phalarope *Phalaropus lobatus* — (1) One at Vadu in Romania on day 3.

Green Sandpiper *Tringa ochropus* — (1) Two at Vadu in Romania on day 3.

Spotted Redshank *Tringa erythropus* — (2) A few in winter plumage seen, on day 3 at Vadu and day 9 at Lake Atanasovsko.

Common Greenshank *Tringa nebularia* — (1) Up to 6 seen on day 3 at Vadu, Romania.

Marsh Sandpiper *Tringa stagnatilis* — (2) Several seen close at Vadu, Romania, and Lake Atanasovsko, Bulgaria, on day 9.

Wood Sandpiper *Tringa glareola* — (2) Several seen close at Lake Atanasovsko, Bulgaria, on day 9.

Terek Sandpiper Xenus cinereus — (1) One at the Pomorie saltpans in Bulgaria on day 7.

Common Redshank *Tringa totanus* — (1) Seen on day 9 at Lake Atanasovsko in Bulgaria.

GULLS AND TERNS: Laridae: (10)

Slender-billed Gull *Chroicocephalus genei* — (1) Two at Pomorie saltpans, Bulgaria, on day 7.

Black-headed Gull Chroicocephalus ridibundus — (9) Common and widespread, seen throughout.

Little Gull Hydrocoloeus minutus — (1) One at the Pomorie saltpans on day 9.

Mediterranean Gull *Ichthyaetus melanocephalus* — (4) Flocks seen on wetlands and farmland in Romania, often in the company of Black-headed Gulls.

Yellow-legged *Larus michahellis* — (9) Common, particularly in Bulgaria.

Caspian Gull Larus cachinnans — (3) Common in Romania, not seen to the south in Bulgaria.

Gull-billed Tern Gelochelidon nilotica — (1) One seen at Vadu in Romania on day 3.

Caspian Tern *Hydroprogne caspia* — (3) Several seen in Romania on days 2 and 3 and 1 at Lake Shabla in Bulgaria on day 6.

Whiskered Tern Chlidonias hybrida — (2) A few seen in Romania on days 2 and 3.

Sandwich Tern Thalasseus sandvicensis — (3) About 20 off Cape Kaliakra on day 5 and 100s perched on poles in the Pomorie saltpans on days 7 and 9.

STORKS: Ciconiidae: (2)

Black Stork Ciconia nigra — (1) One seen in flight over a rice field on the way to Sofia on the last day.

White Stork Ciconia ciconia — (1) Two seen in roadside fields by the highway on the last day.

CORMORANTS: Phalacrocoracidae: (3)

Pygmy Cormorant *Microcarbo pygmaeus* — (5) Common on wetlands in both countries.

Great Cormorant *Phalacrocorax carbo* - (9) Very common on wetlands in both countries.

European Shag *Gulosus aristotelis* — (2) Around a dozen at Cape Kaliakra on day 5 and on rocks before Shabla on day 6, both in Bulgaria.

PELICANS: Pelecanidae: (2)

Great White Pelican *Pelecanus onocrotalus* — (5) Migrating flocks of up to 100 each seen in flight in both countries. Some seen on the water.

Dalmatian Pelican *Pelecanus crispus* — (4) Scattered sightings in both countries with over 30 resting together at Lake Atanasovsko in Bulgaria on day 9.

HERONS AND EGRETS: Ardeidae: (5)

Gray Heron *Ardea cinerea* — (7) Scattered sightings in both countries.

Purple Heron Ardea purpurea — (4) Around 8 seen, often in flight, in both countries.

Great Egret Ardea alba — (8) Scattered sightings in both countries.

Little Egret *Egretta garzetta* — (2) Surprisingly few seen.

Squacco Heron *Ardeola ralloides* — (2) Around 6 seen, on days 3 and 9.

OSPREY: Pandionidae: (1)

Osprey Pandion haliaetus — (4) Several migrating birds seen in both countries.

HAWKS, KITES AND EAGLES: Accipitridae: (7)

European Honey-Buzzard *Pernis apivorus* — (3) Up to 10 individuals seen on migration.

Short-toed Snake-Eagle Circaetus gallicus — (3) Fine views of a two different perched birds and others in flight.

Eurasian Marsh-Harrier *Circus aeruginosus* — (8) Common, several seen on most days in both countries. Mainly females and immatures.

Pallid Harrier Circus macrourus — (1) A superb sub-adult male seen at Histria, Romania, on day 3.

Montagu's Harrier Circus pygargus — (1) A female seen at Cape Kaliakra, Bulgaria, on day 5.

Eurasian Sparrowhawk Accipiter nisus — (8) Up to 10 seen on most days in both countries.

Common Buzzard *Buteo buteo* — (9) Widespread in both countries, often perched at roadsides.

OWLS: Strigidae: (1)

Little Owl *Athene noctua* — (4) Three seen on village rooftops and chimneys in Bulgaria. One heard at dusk by the hotel in Sozopol.

KINGFISHERS: Alcedinidae: (1)

Common Kingfisher Alcedo atthis — (2) Two seen, one at Lake Razelm in Romania on day 2 and one at Lake Mandra in Bulgaria on day 9.

BEE-EATERS: Meropidae: (1)

European Bee-eater *Merops apiaster* — (1) A migrating flock of about 30 birds seen near Tyulenovo, Bulgaria, on day 6.

WOODPECKERS: Picidae: (7)

Middle-spotted Woodpecker *Dendrocoptes medius* — (2) Seem in the Baltata woods, Albena, on day 7 and at Ropotamo on day 8.

Great Spotted Woodpecker *Dendrocopos major* — (2) Three seen near Shabla, Bulgaria, on day 6, others heard. **Syrian Woodpecker** *Dendrocopos syriacus* — (4) Seen and heard in settlements in both countries.

White-backed Woodpecker Dendrocopos leucotos — (1) Subspecies *lilfordi*: two seen in the Strandzha forest in Bulgaria on day 8.

Lesser Spotted Woodpecker *Dryobates minor* — (3) Singles seen on days 7 and 9, one heard in the Strandzha forest on day 8, all in Bulgaria.

Gray-headed Woodpecker *Picus canus* — (2) One in the Baltata woods, Albena, on day 7 and one at Ropotamo on day 8, both in Bulgaria.

Eurasian Green Woodpecker *Picus viridis* — (3) Several heard and two seen in Bulgaria: one at Strandzha on day 8 and one by Lake Mandra on day 9.

FALCONS: Falconidae: (3)

Eurasian Kestrel *Falco tinnunculus* — (9) Common and widespread in both countries.

Red-footed Falcon Falco vespertinus — (1) One juvenile seen on a wire near Balgarevo on day 5.

Eurasian Hobby Falco subbuteo — (8) Numerous sightings of migrating birds in both countries.

OLD WORLD ORIOLES: Oriolidae: (1)

Eurasian Golden Oriole Oriolus oriolus — (1) A leader-only sighting at Lake Mandra, Bulgaria, on day 9.

SHRIKES: Laniidae: (1)

Red-backed Shrike *Lanius collurio* — (6) Many seen, mostly juveniles moving south, in both countries.

CROWS AND JAYS: Corvidae: (6)

Eurasian Jay Garrulus glandarius — (5) Many seen on the move, mostly in Bulgaria.

Eurasian Magpie *Pica pica* — (9) Common in both rural and urban areas throughout.

Eurasian Jackdaw Corvus monedula — (10) Common in both rural and urban areas throughout.

Rook Corvus frugilegus — (6) Flocks of several 100 often in farmland in Romania.

Hooded Crow Corvus cornix — (9) Common and widespread, seen throughout but not in large flocks.

Common Raven *Corvus corax* — (6) Scattered sightings, usually of one or two birds in flight.

TITS AND CHICKADEES: Paridae: (2)

Eurasian Blue Tit Cyanistes caeruleus — (2) Two seen on day 9 by Lake Mandra in Bulgaria.

Great Tit Parus major — (6) Fairly common in wooded places in Bulgaria.

LARKS: Alaudidae: (3)

Wood Lark Lullula arborea — (2) Several, some singing, on wires near Balgarevo, Bulgaria, on day 6.

Eurasian Skylark Alauda arvensis — (1) Four seen on day 2 in a field by Lake Razelm in Romania.

Crested Lark *Galerida cristata* — (5) Scattered sightings in both countries, often at roadsides and around villages.

SWALLOWS AND MARTINS: Hirundinidae: (3)

Bank Swallow Riparia riparia — (1) Less than 10, seen amongst Barn Swallows on day 2.

Barn Swallow *Hirundo rustica* — (10) Flocks seen on passage every day.

Common House-Martin *Delichon urbicum* — (3) A few seen on the move with Barn Swallows.

LEAF WARBLERS: Phylloscopidae: (3)

Willow Warbler *Phylloscopus trochilus* — (8) The most numerous warbler seen, many on migration.

Common Chiffchaff *Phylloscopus collybita* — (8) Common, but not as numerous as Willow Warbler; some also heard singing.

Wood Warbler *Phylloscopus sibilatrix* — (1) One in the St. John Casius monastery garden in Romania on day 4 and one at Pomorie in Bulgaria on day 7.

LONG-TAILED TITS: Aegithalidae: (1)

Long-tailed Tit Aegithalos caudatus — (2) Seen at Ropotamo on day 8 and around 30 at Lake Mandra on day 9.

SYLVIID WARBLERS: Sylviidae: (3)

Eurasian Blackcap Sylvia atricapilla — (1) A male and a female at Cape Kaliakra, Bulgaria, on day 5.

Lesser Whitethroat *Curruca curruca* - (3) Several sightings, in both countries.

Greater Whitethroat *Curruca communis* — (1) One seen by Lake Mandra, Bulgaria, on day 9.

NUTHATCHES: Sittidae: (1)

Eurasian Nuthatch Sitta europea — (1) Seen on day 8 at Ropotamo, Bulgaria.

TREECREEPERS: Certhiidae: (1)

Short-toed Treecreeper *Certhia brachydactyla* — (2) Seen at Baltata woods on day 7 and day 8 at Ropotamo, Bulgaria.

STARLINGS: Sturnidae: (1)

European Starling Sturnus vulgaris — (9) Common and widespread in both countries, often in large flocks.

THRUSHES: Turdidae: (1)

Eurasian Blackbird *Turdus merula* — (2) Surprisingly few seen, just two observations in Bulgaria.

OLD WORLD FLYCATCHERS AND CHATS: Muscicapidae: (7)

Spotted Flycatcher *Muscicapa striata* — (9) Common in both countries, seen throughout.

European Robin *Erithacus rubecula* — (2) Surprisingly, just two seen, both in Bulgaria.

Red-breasted Flycatcher *Ficedula hypoleuca* — (7) Many seen and heard, in both countries, all on migration.

Common Redstart *Phoenicurus phoenicurus* — (4) Around 6 seen, in both countries.

Black Redstart Phoenicurus ochruros — (2) Around 10 seen, on days 4 and 8.

Whinchat Saxicola rubetra — (3) Single birds seen in both countries.

Northern Wheatear *Oenanthe oenanthe* — (2) One on the ruins at Cape Kaliakra and one near Balgarevo, both in Bulgaria.

OLD WORLD SPARROWS: Passeridae: (3)

House Sparrow *Passer domesticus* — (8) Common and widespread, seen in many settlements and around farms.

Spanish Sparrow *Passer hispaniolensis* — (2) Small parties seen at Durankulak and Lake Shabla in Bulgaria.

Eurasian Tree Sparrow *Passer montanus* — (8) Fairly common, seen in rural areas in both countries.

PIPITS AND WAGTAILS: Motacillidae: (3)

Western Yellow Wagtail Motacilla flava — (2) Seen on days 7 and 9 at the Pomorie saltpans, Bulgaria.

White Wagtail Motacilla alba — (9) Common and widespread. Many passage flocks seen.

Tree Pipit Anthus trivialis — (2) Several seen on roadside wires near Balgarevo, Bulgaria, on day 6.

FINCHES AND EUPHONIAS: Fringillidae: (3)

Common Chaffinch *Fringilla coelebs* — (2) Seen in woods at Ropotamo, Strandzha and by Lake Mandra, in Bulgaria.

Eurasian Linnet *Linaria cannabina* — (1) About 6 seen near Balgarevo, Bulgaria, on day 6.

European Goldfinch Carduelis carduelis — (6) Small flocks seen in both countries.

OLD WORLD BUNTINGS: Emberizidae: (1)

Corn Bunting *Emberiza calandra* — (2) Around 100 seen on wires in farmland near Balgarevo, Bulgaria, on day 5.

OTHER WILDLIFE

Eurasian Red Squirrel Sciurus vulgaris — (1) One in the Baltata woods, Albena, on day 7.

Fallow Deer Dama dama - (1) Two seen near Ropotamo, Bulgaria, on day 8.

Spur-thighed Tortoise *Testudo graeca* — (1) One found on the road and moved into grassland before Shabla, Bulgaria, on day 6.

Caspian Whip Snake Dolichophis caspius — (1) One by Lake Mandra, Bulgaria, on day 8.

Balkan Green Lizard Lacerta trilineata — (1) One seen in Balgarevo, Bulgaria, on day 6.

Praying Mantis *Mantis religiosa* — (1) One fine, female specimen, found on the bus door (later safely moved) on day 6.
