Best of Belize Species List | February 17-25, 2024 with Naturalist Journeys

Summary:

Our world-class local guides in Belize made this trip the spectacular journey that it was. From the ancient Mayan ruins to the secrets hiding in the jungle, each day offered new surprises for us and we explored as many habitat types as we could, making the most of our short time in this beautiful country while just staying at two beautiful ecolodges. Cooking traditional tortillas and tamales in the village and meeting the family of our local guide was a treat, and doing much of our travel by boat or safari vehicle made the trip extra special. Wildlife and the habitats were stunning at every turn, including the massive cahoon palms, the tiny and elaborate leafhoppers, and the alien roars of the Yucatan Black Howler Monkey. And of course we had tons of avian highlights, with some of our favorites along the way being the fabulous Ocellated Turkey, Spectacled Owl, and Purple-crowned Fairy at Chan Chich, a family (!) of the elusive Yellow-breasted Crake, Blue Seedeater, and Black-collared Hawks at Crooked Tree Swamp, and Chestnut-colored Woodpecker, Yellow-headed Parrot, and the beautiful Keel-billed Toucan at Lamanai.

Following is a list of the birds, mammals, reptiles and amphibians we were fortunate to observe during the trip.

Mammals: (12)

Southern Opossum Didelphis marsupialis – One seen during a night drive at Chan Chich

Proboscis (long-nosed) Bat *Rhynchonycteris naso* – Found roosting during our river spotlight safari on the New River at Lamanai

Greater Fishing Bat *Noctilio leporinus* – Seen dipping into the water at prey while on the spotlight safari by boat at Lamanai

Central American Agouti *Dasyprocta punctata* – Seen at both of the ecolodges, Chan Chich and Lamanai while exploring the jungle habitatas

Deppe's Squirrel *Sciurus deppei* – One seen in a tree during a drive around the grounds of Chan Chich **Yucatan Squirrel** *Sciurus yucatanensis* – Seen on the grounds at Lamanai

Yucatan Black Howler Monkey *Alouatta pigra* – Seen or heard each day of the trip at both Lamanai and Chan Chich

Central American Spider Monkey *Ateles geoffroyi* – Seen well while visiting Chan Chich, including family groups that would move through the trees right overhead

White-tailed Deer Odocoileus virginianus – Seen each day while staying in the preserved grounds of Chan Chich White-nosed Coati Nasua narica – Seen on a couple of occasions while at Lamanai, including at the ruins site Gray Fox Urocyon cinereoargenteus – Seen during a spotlight drive at Chan Chich

Puma *Puma concolor* – A pair seen while on a spotlight safari at Chan Chich and one seen crossing the road in front of our safari vehicle at midday while returning from the escarpment

Reptiles and Amphibians: (7)

Morelet's Crocodile *Crocodylus moreletii* – Seen on a few occasions, including while cruising the New River at Lamanai and at the lettuce pond at Chan Chich

Ghost Anole Anolis lemurinus – Seen incidentally a couple of times around the lodge grounds and in the leaf litter

Black Spiny-tailed Iguana *Ctenosaura similis* – One seen at Crooked Tree swamp during our boat tour of the marsh there

Green Iguana *Iguana iguana* — Several seen at Lamanai, almost daily in the trees overhanging the river and lagoon

Brown Basilisk *Basiliscus vittatus* – Seen around the small pond at Lamanai and the grounds of Chan Chich **House Gecko** *Hemidactylus frenatus*— Often heard and seen around the lights and buildings at our lodges **Mexican Smilisca** *Smilisca boudinii* – One seen on the stairs at Black Orchid and one on a boat ramp during a spotlight safari at Lamanai
