Grand Oaxaca: Valley, Mountains & Coast Non-Avian Species List Supplement October 20 – 31, 2024 with Naturalist Journeys



Compiled by Emily Hjalmarson and Brett Roberts with contributions from Naturalist Journeys host guide James P. Smith, and field contributions from Ana, Anne, Kathy, John, Laura, George, Mark and our top-class local guide Eric Martinez.

We used iNaturalist to catalog all our photos of non-avian taxonomic groups observed on the trip (excluding plants so far) and extracted the following list of species. The list also includes some sight-only observations from other trip participants. Each taxonomic entry listed is a link to the corresponding page on iNaturalist so readers can view images, observations, facts, etc. We noted when species were endemics (some are noted as possible endemics when a basic literature search was not conclusive) and which taxa were observed exclusively at our moth light (we ran a moth light and sheet at two of the lodges during the trip). When "official" common names were not found, we assigned a general common name based on the taxon group. The list follows a general taxonomic order (e.g., grouping butterflies by families), but does not follow any specific order exactly.

Red-bellied/Mexican Gray Squirrel <u>(Sciurus aureogaster)</u> – a few singles noted in the grounds at the Mision de los Angeles and in the mountains at La Cumbre.

Pantropical Spotted Dolphin (Stenella attenuata) - awesome views on the Santa Cruz Pelagic (10/29).
Spinner Dolphin (Stenella longirostris) - great looks at this spectacular dolphin on the Santa Cruz Pelagic (10/29).

Reptiles and Amphibians (18)

Leatherback Sea Turtle (*Dermochelys coriacea*) – one spotted by Eric on the Santa Cruz Pelagic (10/29). Olive Ridley Sea Turtle (*Lepidochelys olivacea*) - quite a few on the Santa Cruz Pelagic (10/29). Western Spiny-tailed Iguana (*Ctenosaura pectinata*) Black Spiny-tailed Iguana (*Ctenosaura similis*) Green Iguana (*Iguana iguana*) - quite common around the hotel and streets of Huatulco. Southern Crevice Spiny Lizard (*Sceloporus aureolus*) - Endemic to Mexico. Mexican Emerald Spiny Lizard (*Sceloporus formosus*) - Endemic to Mexico. Graphic Spiny Lizard (*Sceloporus grammicus*) Horrible Spiny Lizard (*Sceloporus horridus*) - Endemic to Mexico. Longtail Spiny Lizard (Sceloporus siniferus) - Endemic to Mexico. Eastern Spiny Lizard (Sceloporus spinosus) - Teotitlan del Valle (10/21). Tropical Tree lizard (Urosaurus bicarinatus) - Endemic to Mexico. Rainbow Ameiva (Holcosus undulatus) Clouded Anole (Anolis nebulosus) Brown Anole (Anolis nebulosus) Brown Anole (Anolis sagrei) Asian House Gecko (Hemidactylus frenatus) – a few 'in-room' sightings from the Hotel Villablanca. Showy Leopard Frog (Lithobates spectabilis) - one was skillfully captured and handled for all to see by Emily at Teotitlan del Valle (10/21). Endemic to Mexico.

Sharks and Fish (4)

Pelagic Thresher Shark <u>(Alopias pelagicus)</u> - One individual was seen breaching the surface multiple times during our mini-pelagic boat trip. A very exciting experience, given that this is an endangered species due to its low reproductive rate. This is the smallest of the three species of thresher sharks, and they take the longest to reach sexual maturity (7-13 years).

Remora (*Echeneidae*) - Attached to the Thresher Shark and discovered in photos of it jumping out of the water later on. Not enough detail in the photos to ID beyond family, but still a neat addition to the list!

Common Mullet (Mugil)

Flying Fish <u>(*Exocoetidae*)</u> – We saw a few individuals during our mini-pelagic boat trip. It was great fun to watch them jumping and gliding above the water right beside the boat. Although we don't know which species (they were too fast for our cameras!), it seems that Whitetip Flying Fish (*Cheilopogon xenopterus*) is a common one in the area.
