The group of eleven participants, plus guide Chris, gathered for an early dinner at the Wyndham Costa del Sol Hotel at Lima Airport. The following morning we checked in at the airport for our flight to Iquitos (at 2:45 am).

We were based for three nights at the Ceiba Tops Lodge, by the Amazon River, north of Iquitos and then met the MV Zafiro in Nauta to spend the next six nights exploring the Marañon River and its tributaries.

It was a very successful trip with 205 species of birds recorded seen of which 15 were heard only, plus 14 mammals, 9 reptiles and amphibians, 9 butterflies and sundry other wildlife.
