Lesser Antilles Endemics: A 3-Island Classic Species List | December 3 – 14, 2024 with Naturalist Journeys



Compiled by guide Chris Harbard with local guides Adé, Willow (St Lucia), Dr Birdy (Dominica), Lystra and Pewee (St Vincent). Our clients included Tom, Holly, Gary and Connie.

The group of four participants, met with guides Chris and Adé at St Lucia airport, then drove to the fabulous Balenbouche Estate to begin our wonderful three-island trip. We were to visit St Lucia, Dominica and St Vincent with a short stop on the bonus island of Barbados. Our main targets were the island and regional endemic birds, as well as any other wonderful wildlife on the way. We had local guides on each island who took us to the very best places for the special birds. We were at the tail end of a very wet rainy season and only had a few of periods of downpour during the trip.

85 bird species were recorded of which two were heard only and three were only seen by the guide, 24 were endemic to Lesser Antilles or individual islands, and 3 were introduced. Details are included below.

Common on all islands

West Indian Mangrove Buckeye Junonia neildi

Seen on several islands.

Orion Cecropian Historis odius

Seen on St Lucia

Orcus Checkered Skipper *Pyrgus orcus*

Seen at Macoucherie, Dominica,

Purple-washed Skipper Panoquina lucas

Seen on St Lucia

Cucumber Moth (I) Diaphania indica

An introduced species, seen on wall of Tamarind Tree Hotel, Dominica.

Fig Sphinx Pachylia ficus

Seen on wall of Tamarind Tree Hotel, Dominica.

DRAGONFLIES & DAMSELFLIES: Odonata (3):

Rambur's Forktail Ischnura ramburii

Common. Seen at Balenbouche, St Lucia

Antillean Skimmer Orthemis macrostigma

Seen on wall of Tamarind Tree Hotel, Dominica.

Very common. Seen on St Lucia and Dominica

Band-winged Dragonlet Erythrodiplax umbrata

A widespread species, seen in Dominica and Barbados.
