Costa Rica Monteverde & More! | Species List Main Tour: March 18 – 28, 2025 Caribbean Side Post Tour: March 27 – 30, 2025 with Naturalist Journeys

This tour of Costa Rica covered the Monteverde cloud forest area with an extension to the La Selva Biological Station and the Sarapiqui area's Caribbean lowlands, providing a vast awry of habitats for viewing birds, nature, and the breathtaking scenery. We enjoyed three boat trips and stayed at an excellent variety of lodges that provided delicious meals including Costa Rican specialties. All of the participants contributed to the number and variety of species that the group observed.

BIRDS: 330 species were recorded, 20 were heard only, 1 Endemic species and 16 Regional Endemics were seen.

Following is a list of the mammals, reptiles and amphibians, and butterflies that were observed during this trip.

MAMMALS: (16)

Brown-throated Three-toed Sloth *Bradypus variegatus*—Seen at five different locations to the delight of the group

Hoffmann's Two-toed Sloth *Choloepus hoffmanni*—Seen twice on the extension to La Selva for a nice comparison with Three-toed Sloth

Proboscis Long-nose Bat Rhynchonycteris naso—Seen on the visit to the Pierella Gardens

Honduran White Bat Ectophylla alba—Shown to the group by the guide at the Pierella Gardens

Greater Sac-winged Bat Saccopteryx bilineata—Seen on the wall at the Pierella Gardens

Pygmy Round-eared Bat *Lophostoma brasiliense*—Seen roosting in a hollowed out termite nest at Pierella Gardens

Common Tent-making Bat *Uroderma bilobatum*—A group seen roosting under a large leaf at the Pierella Garden

Central American Agouti Dasyprocta punctata—Seen at four locations usually crossing the trails

Variegated Squirrel Sciurus variegatoides—Seen almost daily at many locations

Central American Spider Monkey *Ateles geoffroyi*—Family with young seen near the cabins at the Cano Negro Lodge

White-faced Capuchin Cebus capucinus—Seen on the walk from Cerro Lodge

Mantled Howler Monkey *Alouatta palliata*—Heard daily in the early morning at Cano Negro and Selva Verde Lodges

White-tailed Deer Odocoileus virginianus—Seen twice during drives while traveling

Common Raccoon Procyon lotor—Seen at the Cano Negro lodge

White-nosed Coati Nasua narica—Seen on a drive at Monteverde

Tayra *Eira barbara*—Pair seen crossing the road near the Curicancha Reserve

REPTILES AND AMPHIBIANS: (19)

Spectacled Caiman Caiman crocodilus—Seen on the boat trips at Cano Negro National Wildlife Refuge

American Crocodile *Crocodylus acutus*—Seen on the Tarcoles River and nice comparison with a caiman on the Cano Negro boat trip

Black River Turtle Rhinoclemmys funerea—Seen on the boat trip on the Sarapiqui River

Mesoamerican Slider Trachemys venusta—Seen on a pond at the Pierella Garden

Asian House Gecko Hemidactylus frenatus—Heard or seen at most of our lodges

Black Spiny-tailed Iguana Ctenosaura similis—Seen twice at Monteverde

Green Iguana Iguana —Seen in trees on all boat trips

Brown Basilisk Basiliscus vittatus—Seen only once, driving from Cerro Lodge

Green Basilisk Basiliscus plumifrons—Seen from the boat on the Sarapiqui River

Middle American Ameiva Holcosus festivus—Seen on walk at Carara National Park

Fer-de-lance *Bothraups asper*—Seen twice, this dangerous snake was first found on the night walk at Celeste Mountain Lodge and again on walk at La Selva.

Red-eyed Tree Frog Agalychnis callidryas—Found on night walk at Celeste Mountain Lodge

Masked Tree Frog Smilisca phaeota—Seen on night walk at Celeste Mountain Lodge

Strawberry Poison Dart Frog *Oophaga pumilio*—This very small frog was seen on walk at La Selva Biological Station

Green-and-black Poison Dart Frog *Dendrobates auratus*—Great photos on our walk at Carara Naional Park **Giant Toad** *Rhinella horribilis*—Seen on the Tarcoles River trip

Slender-nose (brown) Anole Anolis fuscoauratus—Seen on a restaurant floor and at La Selva

Smoky Jungle Frog Leptodactylus pentadactylus—Seen in Monteverde

Green Vine Snake Oxybelis fulgidus—Seen on a tree during walk to the waterfall at the Tenorio Volcano National Park
